Rider Qualification Levels

ALL TRAIL RIDING MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A STATE-CERTIFIED GUIDE.

Level 1 = Beginner/Novice.

Ride only Level 1 horses under instruction at Ranch.

Level 2 = Learned.

Ride & practice Level 1 & 2 horses Ranch & Trail; Level 3 horses under instruction at Ranch.

Level 3 = Intermediate/Skilled.

Ride Level 1, 2 & 3 horses at Ranch & Trail; Level 4 under instruction at Ranch.

Level 4 = Advanced.

Ride all Level 1, 2, 3 & 4 horses at Ranch and on trails.

Level 5 = Guide/Wrangler.

Registered/State-Certified Guide/Wrangler for Flyspur Ranch. Ride all horses, guide others.
